# DECEMBER FARM TASKS: SEED ORDERING

The seed catalogs are starting to arrive and we know everyone gets excited and are usually tempted to order more than they need. Crop plans should be the gold standard for your ordering to make sure you get the right amount and variety. Never made a crop plan before? Here's an article from Utah State Univ. Extension that talks about Crop Planning for CSAs, but even if you don't have a CSA, there is good content that you should consider when flipping through these catalogs.

Once you have a crop plan, here are some extra things to consider when ordering seed:

- · Place your seed order early
- · Look for varieties that adapted to your growing environment
- · Focus on productive varieties
- · Purchase seed from reputable seed companies
- Check for pelleted, GMO, Organic, heirloom, etc. labels that will fit into your growing practices

These thoughts were taken from an article published by University of Arkansas Extension, and if you would like to read futher on why these specific considerations are important, we encourage you to look at the whole article which you can find at their Center for Arkansas Farms and Food website.

As we mentioned last time. This is our new TOPP corner! To reiterate: Transition To Organic Partnership Program (TOPP) is a network assembled by the USDA's National Organic Program to support transitioning and organic producers with mentorship and resources.

In addition to many other things happening in our state, CT NOFA and NOFA Mass are collecting information to gauge interest in processing services for certified organic poultry for farms. As the demand for organic products continues to grow, we are exploring the possibility of supporting dedicated facilities for organic poultry processing that meet USDA standards. This could provide a valuable opportunity for your operation to expand into the organic market and tap into new consumer segments.

We are exploring the need of a dedicated USDA-certified organic poultry processing facility in Connecticut and would love your feedback to assess the demand.

# LAND CAPITAL MARKET ACCESS PROGRAM GUIDANCE RELEASED

Connecticut Department of Agriculture released guidance for a historic new program which will increase access to farm ownership opportunities, market access, and capital funding for socially disadvantaged farmers in Connecticut. Connecticut is the only state department of agriculture to be awarded funding from U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for the implementation of the Increasing Land, Capital, and Market Access (LCMA) program.
